



INTRODUCTION

We are proud to present our second Annual Report and share our journey that continues to be full of learning and inspiration. Our Mozaik bridge that connects our donors largely in the UK with the civil society in Turkey has further strengthened thanks to our supporters and we have started to make a more impactful change in the social welfare of vulnerable groups in our homeland. In our second year, we have seen both our fundraising and grant-giving activities evolve, grow and deepen in our London community as well as the civil society in Turkey.

Our annual Fund Programs, in partnership with Support Foundation for Civil Society (Sivil Toplum için Destek Vakfı) have progressed to introduce, for the first time, a Gender Equality Fund, an Institutional Fund and a Culture & Arts Fund in addition to the relaunch of the Children's Fund. Institutional Fund allows us to be one of the very few organisations in the civil society space that offers much-needed core funding for capacity building as well as mentorship and ongoing support. Culture & Arts Fund has been an incredible journey for us as we learned from the highly renowned Istanbul Culture and Arts Foundation (İstanbul Kültür ve Sanat Vakfı, IKSVA) team, who supported us with their valuable expertise. We believe in the power of change through art and are lucky to be able to support such amazing initiatives.

In addition to our themed funds designed to support civil society in Turkey, our second year

also brought our first Emergency Relief Fund that we quickly launched as a response to the tragic earthquake that hit Elazığ in January 2020. Our Justgiving page for Elazığ Earthquake Relief Fund received donations from 227 supporters, totalling more than GBP 21,000 in a very short amount of time. We saw ourselves moving to a wider circle in the community as we added many first-time donors and supporters to our group of friends who have been with us since the start. Our ability to help at a time of loss and grief confirmed the value of our capabilities as a platform and the connections we have built with civil society organisations active in the field.

We continued to organise events and activities in line with our main themes. Jointly with TurkishWIN London Chapter, we screened the film "You Can Do It!" ("Yapabilirsiniz!") by Tuluhan Tekelioğlu and hosted a panel discussion on 'Success Against the Odds'. This well-attended event was to kick-off and support our Gender Equality Fund. We hosted our first Annual Meeting and Dinner and updated our donors on our first-year activities and celebrated our achievements with all our supporters, including not only our financial donors but also the amazing pro-bono service providers that have helped us along the way including Troy Digital, Reed Smith, Nople Productions, Alton & Co and Juno London. We organised our third Study Trip in Istanbul where we met with and visited several grantee organisations as well as civil society experts. We participated in the BGC

International Charity Day with our ambassador Francesco Molinari, one of the top golfers in the world, who also feels passionate about our work, especially around refugees. We were able to secure significant funding thanks to this special event. We organised the Youth £4 Youth Challenge that enabled children in London to support children in need via our Children's Fund.

In addition to the events and activities we organised, our second year saw the creation of our "Friends of Mozaik" ambassadors circle who have put in amazing efforts to support our platform via organising events such as a beautiful piano recital by Rasim Yağız İlhan and a New Year's Bazaar where many artisans and entrepreneurs participated with their crafts and services. We have also been the proud recipient of many special donations, from gifts for birthday celebrations to corporate grants thanks to our wonderful group of friends and supporters. Most special of all was to receive donations in memory of our dear friend Meltem Göçer, who sadly passed away in 2019. We were proud to support very special charities selected jointly with Meltem's family and will proudly serve as a platform for Meltem Göçer Fund also in future years.

With such a busy period behind us, and a total of more than GBP 250,000 raised since our inception two years ago, we have seen the little pieces of our "mozaik" become more woven into the fabric of our community. In this report, we are

presenting a treasured list of funds and grantees that we have supported. Whilst we are very proud of our performance thus far, we know this is still only the very beginning and we still have a lot to learn. Especially in a year when the COVID pandemic transformed our lives globally, funding of civil society is important more than ever, not only because the existing disadvantageous communities will direly be affected, but also because new social needs and challenges will need to be tackled in innovative ways. Civil society organisations need funders initiatives like us that are fast, flexible and responsive. We are aware that we also may need to adjust our operations according to the requirements of the new realities and adapt to this new environment.

We are excited about growing our platform together and hopefully looking back at this report fondly in years to come and celebrate our beautiful journey. Thank you once again for all the support and trust you have placed in us.


OUR MISSION

We focus on the participation and social welfare of vulnerable groups in the society, mainly through the advancement of **education, health, children's and women's rights, and environmental issues**. Embracing the rich cultural heritage of Turkey, **we are non-governmental and politically non-affiliated**.

We work with local charities, civil society organisations and citizen initiatives that strive to empower local communities and help drive social change through innovative means. Our main role is to provide funding for our partner charities, projects and programmes through donations and fundraising events in the UK with a passion to support and give back.

OUR FUNDS

2019 saw the creation of our thematic funds to be able to better manage our donations and fundraising efforts as well as to give supporters a means to make cause-specific donations. Our funds are as follows:

- Children's Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of civil society organisations working to establish children's access to their basic rights.
- Culture & Arts Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of civil society organisations that use culture and arts related activities as a means to improve cultural rights, participation in public life and social cohesion.
- Emergency Relief Fund aims to support organisations and people affected by natural disasters or other adverse events and whose needs are urgent and time-sensitive. This fund was launched following the earthquake in Elazığ in January 2020.
- Gender Equality Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of women's and LGBTI+ civil society organisations working to promote women's rights and gender equality in Turkey.
- Institutional Fund aims to strengthen and build the organisational core capacity of civil society organisations.
- Meltem Göçer Fund was established in August 2019 in memory of our beloved friend.

We collaborate with our local partner Support Foundation for Civil Society (SFCS) throughout our grant process. Turkey Mozaik Foundation commits to a minimum grant amount for each fund. A call for proposals for each fund, with specific priorities and application criteria, is announced on the websites and social media outlets of both organisations. Following a shortlisting process based on the criteria described previously, Turkey Mozaik Foundation Board with the participation of experts from SFCS decide on the final list of grantees for the fund. Based on Turkey Mozaik Foundation's grant commitment to the fund and selection outcomes, some organisations are solely funded by us and some of them are co-funded with SFCS. Each organisation signs a grant agreement with SFCS that defines their scope of activities that will be covered with a budget attached, and SFCS provides three reports (initiation, interim and final) to Turkey Mozaik Foundation for the Fund and/or each grantee.

We reviewed 316 applications and selected 16 organisations to support in 2019. Below is the breakdown by fund of the grants distributed this year. Grants for the Emergency Relief Fund were distributed in January 2020 and was followed by a specific relief fund dedicated to refugees in February 2020.



“You can do it!” Film Screening & Panel: March 2019

On 13 March 2019, Turkey Mozaik Foundation and TurkishWin organised an evening of learning, sharing and inspiration to celebrate International Women’s Day.

During the sold-out event, held at Microsoft Reactor London, we had the opportunity to watch the uplifting documentary “Yapabilirsin!” (“You Can do It!”) by Tuluhan Tekelioğlu, about the success stories of amazing women from very diverse backgrounds in Turkey.

The film screening was followed by a stimulating panel discussion with four extraordinary women, who shared their stories and experiences.

All net proceeds from the event and campaign were donated to the Gender Equality Fund.

Study Visit: July 2019

On the first day of our study trip in Istanbul, we started the day with a thought-provoking panel on the State of Education and Children's Rights in Turkey, with panellist Burcu Meltem Arık Akyüz from the Education Reform Initiative and Gözde Durmuş from Istanbul Bilgi University Child Studies Unit. The valuable data and research compiled by the two organisations shed light on the pressing issues on children's rights and how our future grants could be better focused for long-lasting impact. The second panel of the morning featured two grantees supported by the Gender Equality Fund: İpek Bozkurt (We Will Stop Femicides Platform) and Özgür Sunata & Aybeniz Karataş (Women's Solidarity Foundation) discussed their upcoming activities in 2019/2020, made possible with your donations. We had our delicious lunch prepared by Maide Kitchen, a women's social enterprise. In the

afternoon, Özge Sönmez (Yuva Association) led us through a game of identifying endemic animal and plant species in Turkey, and presented Yuva's activities within the Ecological Literacy Programme that we supported in 2018/2019. We then visited Small Projects Istanbul, a community centre in Fatih which provides enrichment, integration and livelihood activities for Syrian and other displaced families rebuilding their lives in the city.

We were hosted by the Istanbul Foundation for Culture and Arts on the second day of our study visit. Özlem Ece and Elif Obdan introduced the Foundation's activities to promote and support arts nationwide and the recently established Alt Kat. This was followed by the presentations from two grantees supported by the Children's Fund: Aslı Yıkıcı, Science Heroes Association and Burak Ulman from Another School is Possible Association. We were delighted to be reunited with our 2018 grantees Mine Ekinci (Rural Schools Transformation Network), Yeliz Baki (Music for Peace Foundation) and Bego Demir (Clean Clothes Campaign Turkey) for lunch. Our day concluded with a site visit to Sulukule Volunteers Association in Fatih. The association works with the community to improve school enrolment and attendance rates locally.

We were inspired by the commitment of our grantees to make a difference and returned to the UK energised to work even harder to extend our impact on civil society and vulnerable populations in Turkey. Our heartfelt thanks go to Liana Varon from Support Foundation for Civil Society for organising and leading this study trip so wonderfully.

BGC Partners Charity Day: September 2019

We were very proud to have Francesco Molinari take part in BGC Partners Charity Day as the ambassador for Turkey Mozaik Foundation.

As a friend and supporter of Turkey Mozaik Foundation since the early days, Francesco has found Turkey Mozaik Foundation's mission and especially our work to support Syrian refugee women and children very close to his heart.

Francesco was one of a host of celebrities including Duke of Sussex Prince Harry, comic Jimmy Carr, Game Of Thrones star Kit Harrington, London Mayor Sadiq Khan, former England football manager Sam Allardyce and England World Cup-winning cricket captain Eoin Morgan taking part in the BGC Partners charity day.

Every year on September 11th, in conjunction with the Cantor Fitzgerald Relief Fund, BGC Partners commemorates 658 friends and colleagues and the 61 Eurobrokers employees who were tragically killed



on this day in 2001 by distributing 100% of their global revenues to the Relief Fund and many other charities around the world. We were extremely grateful to have received a significant donation on this day.



Youth £4 Youth Challenge: October 2019

We invited our young supporters to participate in the Youth £4 Youth challenge to bring their big ideas to life and contribute to our fundraising efforts for our Children's Fund. The challenge ran through the month of October.

25 children participated with projects ranging from bake sales to tshirt painting. Participating children learned and experienced social responsibility and reflected on how their actions can really make a difference to others.

Studies have shown that participating in activities where they can contribute to social good can increase their self-esteem and a sense of pride by planning and developing an idea and seeing it through from start to finish. Furthermore, fundraising gives children a sense of empowerment as they often do not have the monetary resources available to them to create change. Through fundraising they can feel that they are able to contribute to a process of change. We sincerely hope our participants benefited from our project. We are very thankful to our young supporters.

OUR LOCAL PARTNER

Our partnership with the Support Foundation for Civil Society (SFCS, Sivil Toplum için Destek Vakfı) grew stronger in 2019.

SFCS is our main partner providing local know-how and connections within the civil society landscape in Turkey. As a charity founded in 2015 in Istanbul to change the philanthropic giving culture in Turkey, SFCS is one of the very few community foundations that provide grants to smaller and less well-known local charities. Turkey Mozaik Foundation and SFCS are in constant communication throughout the year around a variety of topics and it is broadly SFCS's methodology and parameters that have helped us establish our criteria for grant applications and selection.

Our partnership has four main aspects:

- **Due diligence:** Through our partnership with SFCS we are able to donate through a trusted system that carries out the necessary due diligence on grant applications received.
- **Reporting:** SFCS is our main partner helping us ensure transparent reporting of the use of funds.
- **Co-funding:** Majority of our grantees were jointly funded by Turkey Mozaik Foundation and SFCS. Together, we are able to increase our impact.
- **Events:** SFCS through their connective role host our annual study trips.





Gender Equality Fund

Gender Equality Fund aims to support civil society initiatives that promotes women's rights and gender equality in Turkey through new and innovative projects, campaigns and advocacy activities and institutional development of women's and LGBTI+ organisations. The Fund was launched in 2019.

Calls for applications were open between 6-25 March 2019. From 34 applications, three organisations were selected for project or core funding between May 2019 and June 2020.

Flying Broom Foundation was established in 1996. Since the late 1990s, the Foundation has played a significant role in building solidarity in the women's movement in Turkey by bringing together women's organisations with different stakeholders from the public sector, universities, media organisations and international civil society. Their main mission is to create change where women are empowered and gender equality is established in all walks of life from education to work life. To achieve this, they raise awareness on gender equality locally and internationally through projects that increase communication and interaction between women's associations. Quite outstanding examples include three "Meetings for National Women's Associations" at the international level. The first one was in 2000 in Beijing with 149 women's associations, the second took place in 2003 and the third one in 2013 with 600 women's organisations from 81 cities. Another one of their backbone projects to increase awareness and promote communications

in gender equality issues is the International Women's Film Festival, which screens films from women directors, invites women directors and producers from all around the world, facilitating communication and collaboration among their networks. Other projects and advocacy activities the Foundation has implemented focus on the areas of early or forced marriages, sexual and gender-based violence, and barriers to girls' education.

As a long-standing women's organisation, The Flying Broom Foundation has been in a restructuring process since 2017. The Foundation, which prioritises building a sustainable institutional capacity to increase its national and international engagement, will use the grant for human resources including costs related to employees, volunteers and external services on accounting and auditing. The grant received from the Turkey Mozaik Foundation will enable the Foundation to focus its core capacity on fundraising and advocacy efforts.

We Will Stop Femicides Platform

We Will Stop Femicides Platform (Kadın Cinayetlerini Durduracağız Platformu) was founded in 2012 as a civil reaction to the homicide of Münevver Karabulut, a young woman brutally killed by her boyfriend, who was aided by his family. The Platform's main aspiration is to fight against gender-based violence and to raise public awareness about the volume of violence against women. To this end, the Platform collects and shares monthly data on femicides in Turkey; monitors court cases on sexual abuse, violence against women and femicides; and organises public awareness campaigns on these cases. The Platform's social impact is especially strong due to its nationwide reach as an organisation, enabling it to have first-hand contact with women and their families. Due to the Platform's constructive approach, its representatives are frequently consulted by national and international media, bar associations, universities and local administrative agencies, including municipalities. Through their experience, the Platform has observed how vital it was to protect at-risk women before violence actually occurs. For this reason, it carries out activism and awareness campaigns on the effective practice of the Law No. 6284 on the Protection of the Family and

the Prevention of Violence against Women. This law urges the state to protect the women, the children, the family members and the victims of stalking, who have been subject to the violence or at the risk of violence, and to regulate procedures and principles with regard to the measures of preventing the violence against them.

With the grant from the Gender Equality Fund, the Platform will develop a program in which municipal employees, muhtars (an elected head of a village or a neighbourhood) and women who are exposed to or threatened with violence will be trained on the Law No. 6284. Municipalities and muhtars are some of the most easily accessible public institutions for women when they are exposed to violence or feel threatened. Therefore, if the employees of these public institutions can guide women correctly to protect themselves, they can contribute to the prevention of potential violations of the law. The Platform will organise trainings and awareness raising activities in two districts in each of the following cities: Istanbul, Manisa, Samsun, Gaziantep and Mersin. Trainings are expected to reach at least 200 municipal employees, muhtars and 400 women.




Institutional Fund

The Institutional Fund aims to strengthen and build the organisational core capacity of civil society organisations by covering costs such as rent, human resources, expert support and travel. The Fund also includes a capacity building component to provide mentorship focusing on improving resource development and financial sustainability; impact measurement, monitoring and evaluation; internal / external communications; and stakeholder relations and advocacy activities.

Calls for applications were open between 12 April - 6 May 2019. From 92 applications, five organisations were selected for core funding and mentoring between August 2019 and August 2020.

Imece Initiative Association

Imece Initiative Association (İmece İnisiyatifi Derneği) was founded in 2014 with the aim to develop activities to improve the living conditions for disadvantaged groups in Çeşme, İzmir and the ambition to take steps against discrimination, injustice and poverty in their communities. While the initiative's primary activity in its early days was providing aid for local families in need, following its registration as an association in 2016, İmece focused on seasonal agricultural workers and the increasing numbers of Syrian, Afghan and Iraqi asylum-seekers who came to Çeşme with the hope of crossing to European Union via Chios. These vulnerable groups often live in unsafe tents in rural areas of İzmir, without access to basic human services. The association, while continuing to provide essential supplies, developed practical and sustainable solutions to improve access to basic needs and established "Imece Village".

Imece Village is an ecological village that operates with the principles of sharing and solidarity for enhancing the livelihoods of refugee women and children through various programmes and activities. Examples of activities in the village include workshops to teach soap and candle

making, jewellery, natural cosmetics and painting as well as farming and permaculture trials and trainings for the "Solar Age" project. As part of the Solar Age project, Imece launched its clean energy product "Energy for Everyone" (EFE) in 2018. This tool seeks to help displaced populations in their journeys by providing light and also serving as a powerbank for mobile phones in emergency crisis situations. EFE is produced by refugee women, helping them to acquire new skills while improving their financial independence and therefore facilitating their integration into local communities.

With the grant from the Institutional Fund, Imece aims to create a marketing and sales network for EFE, and to develop other activities to generate income and raise funds for the organisation. The association will also improve their communications strategy focusing on enhancing its social media presence.

Istanbul Foundation for People with Mental Disabilities (İstanbul Zihinsel Engelliler için Eğitim ve Dayanışma Vakfı, İZEV) was established in 1989 by the families of children with mental disabilities. İZEV carries out activities to support the education, employment and individualisation of mentally disabled children, young people and adults and to create social awareness with regards to their accomplishments. İZEV co-founded a primary school and a vocational training centre providing rehabilitation, therapy and educational services for “different” children and young people. The primary school was granted to the Ministry of National Education and continues its operations with over 450 graduates to date. At the “İZEV Independent Living Centre”, 35 young people participate in a wide variety of activities within an academic, life-skills and vocational education program, supporting their independence, self-realisation, and socialisation. Employment opportunities are provided at the “Down Town Event Cafe” for developing their leadership skills. In 2018, as part of the “Life & Us” project, İZEV launched the “Right to Life – The Wall” campaign with the support of Roger Waters, as a manifesto of “dif-

ferent” individuals. The campaign won over 20 awards nationally and internationally. The Youtube video for the campaign was watched by 5 million people, and a second version is currently in production.

From 2020, the Foundation aims to open new branches both in Turkey and abroad, broadening the scope of their activities and reach. İZEV will use the grant from the Institutional Fund to improve its organisational capacity by developing a strategic plan and adopting its internal processes such as organisational charts, job descriptions and digital archives. The Foundation will also design reporting and follow-up forms to assess its impact. With the grant, İZEV will employ one staff who will be responsible for coordinating these activities and will cover part of the rental costs.

Rural Schools Transformation Network (KODA)

Rural Schools Transformation Network (Köy Okulları Değişim Ağı, KODA) was established in 2016 with the aim to create equal education opportunities and to improve the quality of education in rural schools across Turkey. KODA's activities in the rural areas strive to establish an innovative understanding of education and to support rural development that will spread to the whole community starting from the children. The Network focuses on providing exemplary practices to provide holistic and high-quality education for schools in rural areas, which are often regarded as disadvantageous in many respects. KODA's activities focus on empowering teachers according to their personal and professional needs, building support networks, and implementing workshops with children as a solution to the overcome rural schools' challenges related to pupils' families, curriculum, infrastructure and lack of resources and living conditions in villages. KODA's "Teacher Communities Program" has been active in Şanlıurfa-Harran for three years and in Diyarbakır for two years. "Children's Workshops" are implemented at university departments of education in Muş, Izmir and Samsun for prospective teachers, to gain hands-on experience of teaching in

the rural schools. In collaboration with the Ministry of National Education and the Sabancı Foundation, KODA also completed the "Rural School Teacher's Reference Guide" and "Activity Book for Multi-grade Classes in Rural Schools" which were prepared as an open resource for teachers' use.

KODA will use the grant from the Institutional Fund to improve its financial sustainability with the aim of increasing the number of individual and corporate donors. To reach this goal, KODA will develop a communication a fundraising strategy focusing on fundraising activities and stakeholder relations, integrating an online donation system and monitoring national and international grant opportunities. The grant is being used to cover the salary of the Communications Coordinator and other costs related to the fundraising and communication tools and services.


Culture & Arts Fund



Development Workshop

The Development Workshop (S.S. Kalkınma Atölyesi Bilim, Kültür, Eğitim, Araştırma, Uygulama, Üretim ve İşletme Kooperati, Kalkınma Atölyesi) was established in 2004 as a cooperative to support the social development of Turkey with sustainable and replicable projects based on participatory methods. Areas of particular interest and strength for the Workshop are local development programs, research and capacity building, promoting the cooperative movement, ensuring decent living and working conditions for seasonal migrant agricultural workers and eliminating child labour in different sectors. In addition, the Workshop informs policy recommendations and implementation models by conducting field research in areas such as gender-based social development, rural development and enhancement of the capacity and advocacy of local actors. As a rights-based organisation and a non-profit cooperative, the Development Workshop advocates in the areas of human, children, women and immigrant rights.

The Culture & Arts Fund grant will support the second phase of the Magic Lamp Project which introduces the art of cinema to seasonal agricultural workers as a tool

to express themselves and work collaboratively. The project aims to encourage the workers to use the magic lamp -i.e. camera - to develop their self-awareness, decision-making, responsibility and planning skills and provides an opportunity for the workers to tell about their lives and rights violations they have been facing. The first phase of the project included the children of seasonal agricultural workers in Adana-Çukurova region. In the currently funded project, 30 young people and/or adults in seasonal agricultural worker households from Adana, Ankara and Konya will attend theoretical and practical film shooting trainings and produce three short films following this training. A selection of photographs documenting the process will be presented in exhibitions and used as an advocacy tool. Outputs of the projects will be disseminated in Adana, Ankara and Konya through screenings and exhibitions so that various stakeholders hear the stories of seasonal agricultural workers and take action towards improving their living conditions.

Puruli Culture and Art Association

Area of work: Enabling individuals with disabilities to exercise their social and cultural rights

Puruli Culture and Art Association (Puruli Kültür Sanat Derneği) was established in 2014 with the aims to enable individuals with disabilities to exercise their social and cultural rights, and to add value to cultural memory and long-term accumulation. Puruli, whose name is derived from a Hittite festival to salute the rebirth of nature, works to take culture and arts activities out of the common circuit to reach more people by opening alternative channels, and collaborates with institutions and people who share similar objectives. The Association organises the Accessible Film Festival every year in İstanbul, Eskişehir and Ankara with an accessible infrastructure for the visually, hearing and orthopedically impaired. Festival activities include around 40 film screenings with audio description, sign language and detailed captions; interviews with directors and actors; animation, scenario and dance workshops for various disability groups and autism-friendly screenings. The 7th Accessible Film Festival took place in October 2019.

As part of the Culture & Arts Fund core grant, Puruli will employ one person who will support the current team in organising the Accessible Film Festival. S/he will initiate


meetings and workshops with civil society organisations working in Ankara and other cities in the field of disability to evaluate their expectations for culture and arts activities for their target group. The team member will also organise and if necessary, raise funds for the independent analysis of the audience satisfaction surveys from the previous six years of the festival. Following this research and review of expectations along with the experiences of various stakeholders, Puruli will develop an Accessible Film Festival guideline in coordination with other film festivals in Europe within the Be-In Accessible Film Festival Network. This guideline will be shared widely with other culture and art organisations to facilitate the accessibility of an increasing number of festivals for disabled people.



Children's Fund

The Children's Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of civil society organisations working to establish children's access to their basic rights. Some circumstances that adversely affect children's wellbeing in Turkey, as in other countries, are forced migration, rapid urbanisation, inter-regional inequalities, economic crisis, poverty, globalisation, conflicts, domestic violence and gender inequalities.

Calls for applications were open between 18 December 2019 and 8 January 2020. From 89 applications, five organisations were selected for core or project funding between February 2020 and February 2021.

Colourful Hopes Association

Area of work: Providing equal cultural and social opportunities for children and women in Diyarbakır

The Colourful Hopes Association (Rengarenk Umutlar Derneği, RUMUD) aims to improve the social understanding and adoption of universal human and children's rights principles as set out in the United Nations Declarations of Human and Children's Rights as well as all other international standards of children's rights. The association began its activities at the end of 2017 to develop projects providing equal cultural and social opportunities for children and women who are affected by the conflicts in the Sur-Diyarbakır region or live in disadvantaged neighbourhoods and exposed to discrimination. Their current focus is on projects for the socio-psychological and socio-cultural development of those children aged 5 to 18 years old exposed to regional traumas such as regional conflict or migration, and to lessen the effects of these traumas. They organise playrooms, workshops for children aged 7 to 16 years on topics such

as drama, photography, art, music, folklore, children's rights and gender equality; conversations with leading professionals, artists and sportspeople; and visits to the theatre, cinema, sports events and local attractions. The Association has also established a library of 1500 books in various languages, to improve literacy and access to both educational materials and books to enjoy. Children can also borrow and play with toys from the "Tahir Elçi Toy Library".

The Association has observed, through previous experience that change is facilitated much faster if the work they carry out with youth is augmented through simultaneous similar projects with the families, especially in the areas of children's rights, gender equality, dealing with bullies, growth and development as well as abuse. Therefore, the Association also carries out workshops with women and other social and educational activities such as the International Women's Day events, film screenings, workshops on children's physical and mental health, reproduction and sexual health. For these workshops they receive support from other civil society organisations whose expertise are within the relevant fields.

With the grant from the Children's Fund and the capacity building support, the Colourful Hopes Association aims to strengthen its financial sustainability. They will create a "Financial Governance Principles and Strategy" document and employ a new person to organise their institutional processes in accordance with this strategy.

Idea and Arts Workshop Association

The Idea and Arts Workshop Association (Fikir ve Sanat Atölyesi Derneği, FİSA), was established in 2015 with the aim to support the creation of cultural, scientific, intellectual and artistic productions. To this end, FİSA provides scholarships for students in these fields; implements educational activities such as workshops and panels; collaborates with public institutions, private sector and civil society organisations. The association carries out projects and programs in the fields of child neglect and abuse, child labour, discrimination, child participation, children and migration, disability and education in order to promote children's rights. FİSA, cooperating with different civil society organisations working in the field, contributes to the work of the Prevention of Violence Against Children Network ("Çocuğa Karşı Şiddeti Önlemek için Ortaklık Ağı") as a board member. The association also conducts advocacy activities by following child abuse cases in coordination with the Anti-Impunity Network ("Cezasızlıkla Mücadele Güçbirliği Ağı").

With the Children's Fund grant, FİSA aims to bring together different stakeholders working in the field of children's rights to create a common strategy to fight

discrimination against children. Five two-day workshops to compile and analyse stakeholder views and experiences will be organised for children, parents, professionals working with children (educators, social workers, paramedics, psychologists), journalists and artists as well as representatives from civil society organisations working in relevant fields. FİSA will prepare a "Strategy Set on Discrimination Against Children" which includes the stakeholder views and analysis along with policy recommendations. To raise awareness on the subject, the Strategy Set will be published and made available online for all interested parties such as local governing bodies and public institutions, experts in the children's rights field and members of the press. It is their hope that all people working and caring for children, including families, will gain a new level of awareness on children's rights and have a newfound appreciation of their responsibilities to this end to therefore develop and execute their own practical, implementable methods to fight discrimination against children.

Area of work: Raising awareness about children's rights and child labour

Ordu Women's Empowerment Association (Ordu Kadını Güçlendirme Derneği-ORKAGÜDER) was established in 2010 as a rights-based organisation which works with disadvantaged groups such as young people, disabled people, children and especially women in order to prevent violence and discrimination based on gender in East Black Sea Region of Turkey with Ordu as their centre and projects extending into Samsun, Giresun and Trabzon. The Association conducts awareness-raising activities, advocacy work and research studies on child labour in seasonal agriculture, child neglect and abuse, child protection, children's wellbeing and discrimination against women and children.

Ordu is one of the largest hazelnut producing regions in the world. During the harvest season the region receives intensive seasonal agricultural migration. The workers and their families stay in tents or, mostly, in the areas designated by land owners such as empty areas, barracks, old houses, roadsides or under bridges. Of the estimated 110,000 people that arrive to Ordu for the harvest season, majority are children who often have to work alongside parents. Since 2012, ORKAGÜDER have been working on seasonal agricultural migration and the adverse effects of this migration on families. They meet with local public institutions to improve the living conditions of seasonal agricultural workers and continue their efforts throughout the year to create public awareness on this subject. In the harvest season usually during August and September, the association organises rights-based awareness raising workshops for local children and children of seasonal agricultural workers.

With the support received from the Children's Fund, ORKAGÜDER aims to raise awareness about "children rights and child labour" among local children in Ordu as

well as children who come with seasonal agricultural migration. The project "Children's Rights with Games" ("Oyunlarla Çocuk Hakları") involves the development of an educational games module that focuses on rights of children including discrimination issues, hate speech and child labour in accordance with the universal declaration of children's rights. Working with experts, the Association will organise game workshops which will be piloted in schools by two trainers. By cooperating with public schools and District National Education Directorate, it is expected that 400 children will participate in the activities of the Children's Rights with Games project in Altınordu, a central district of Ordu. It is their goal to further develop the association's experience in this area and turn it into an awareness tool that other civil society organisations can use.

Association of Visually Impaired in Education (Eğitimde Görme Engelliler Derneği, EGED) was established in 2013 with the aim of improving the educational opportunities of visually impaired people, enabling them access information and receive education on equal terms. EGED works with visually impaired students studying at all levels of education, from primary education to non-formal education, teachers with visual impairments working in institutions affiliated with the Ministry of National Education, and parents of visually impaired children. EGED also engages in advocacy activities to ensure that students and teachers with disabilities benefit from new technologies; to resolve any professional challenges faced by disabled teachers; to fight against material or moral abuse of disability and to fight against all kinds of discriminatory practices especially those faced by disabled people.

EGED created “Accessible Notes” (Engelsiz Nota) as an online music library for the visually impaired people in 2018. The online library offers a collection of 480 music pieces by 128 composers in 33 musical genres in the brf format, which can be displayed on Braille terminal or printed from Braille printers. 84 visually impaired

musicians benefited from the project. Music department students and music teachers were also given awareness seminars on music education for the visually impaired. With the support from Turkey Mozaik Foundation's Meltem Göçer Fund, EGED aims to expand the content available in the online library and reach out to a wider group of visually impaired music students. In order to realise this objective, EGED will work with the music departments of at least five universities to prioritise 2,500 classic Turkish music pieces to be added to their library at www.engelsiznota.org in printable Braille format. In order to raise awareness about the topic and reach a wider audience, EGED will also organise panel discussions and promotional activities to introduce the online library.

Music For Peace Foundation

Music for Peace Foundation (Mehmet Selim Baki Barış için Müzik Vakfı - Barış için Müzik) was established in 2005 to eliminate barriers for all children to take part in an artistic life and to make arts education accessible for all. Part of the international El Sistema network, the Foundation establishes orchestras and choirs to positively transform the lives of disadvantaged children and their families through free music education, improving their self-confidence and quality of lives. Music for Peace Foundation has previously received two separate grants (for the “First Step Orchestra” and the “Peace Orchestra” which included refugee children) from Turkey Mozaik Foundation in 2018.

Music for Peace Foundation used the support provided by Meltem Göçer Fund to establish the “Accordion Class” and “Youth Choir” groups where children are trained in instrument groups, choirs and orchestras with a focus on a value system emphasising respect for dif-

ferent sounds, collective work and solidarity through music education. The accordion classes started with 22 students aged between 7 and 9 who started playing an instrument for the first time with 2-hour sessions twice a week and the choir classes started with 35 young people over the age of 15 with 5-hour sessions again, twice a week. Due to the COVID-19 outbreak, Music for Peace Foundation switched to a distance education model. Course materials were produced in video format for all courses and shared in Whatsapp groups with accordion class and youth choir participants. In total, 57 students benefited from the Music for Peace programs within the scope of the project. The accordion class and youth choir performed three concerts: Music for Peace Foundation Open Rehearsal Concert, Don't Stop Me Now project in collaboration with Leipzig Opera Children's Choir and an online April 23rd Turkey National Sovereignty and Children's Day performance in collaboration with Microsoft Turkey.

Olive Seeds Association organizes music, creative arts and sports workshops to support the development of children and youth from rural and disadvantaged areas of Ayvalık.

The Colourful Hours Program provides the children age 6-12 from rural and disadvantaged areas of Ayvalık with a free and environment where they can experience various types of art and other interactive activities to support their development and to gain self-awareness through socializing. These activities are two-hour workshops on art, drama and creative games. It is expected that 300 children from 14 villages and socio-economically disadvantaged urban neighbourhoods will participate in the workshops on music, art, cinema, theatre and creative drama for 8 weeks. This program aims to support children in discovering themselves and their environment with the help of trainers from different disciplines as well as volunteers. In addition, the program encourages participation of families with entertaining home tasks for children to do with their siblings and parents.




