



# INTRODUCTION

## Welcome to our fifth annual report.

s in prior years, our formal annual reporting covers our activities from February 1st each year until the January 31st of the following year. We finalise our year-end reporting for our financials and present an annual report on all our grants and activities for each year. Introduction pages such as these have typically provided a summary for the year covered, along with an optimistic outlook and our plans for the year ahead. In fact, we have signed our previous reports as Turkey Mozaik Foundation team "with ever-growing optimism"

The earthquakes of February 6th 2023 were so devastating and life-shattering, and the following weeks and months were so soul-crunching and heart-breaking that any sense of optimism we wrote about "before the earthquake" felt at times as if they belonged to another era. While our hopes were being severely tested and we had to learn to live with a deep heart-ache about all that had been lost. our community showed an incredible and unprecedented unity to support our Kahramanmaras Earthquake Emergency Relief Campaign, which we launched within the first few hours of the tragedy. Looking back, we see that our previous work, especially Emergency Relief Campaigns following the Elazığ and İzmir Earthquakes, the wildfires of Summer 2021, the refugee crisis and the emergency response to our grantees during COVID-19 gave us the privilege to have open communication channels with the right organisations on the ground. More importantly in terms of establishing "trust" within our community, our previous reporting back to our supporters, e.g. a special event dedicated to report back on our campaign for the Wildfires to explain how their donations were channeled had confirmed our strong and transparent working model.

Thanks to this track record and timely response in the immediate aftermath of the crisis, our campaign gained the support of a much wider circle than we had ever seen before. We were hosted by the BBC and SKY News, the QR codes for our campaign were visible in every setting from small local cafes, school fairs to corporate lounges and with the help of incredible individuals, corporations and philanthropic organisations we have been able to raise almost GBP 4 million from over 18,000 donors. We visited the earthquake zone ourselves and have been working very hard to honour the invaluable trust our community has placed in us and are still in the process of providing support to the civil society organisations across over 70 different projects that help the survivors and provide medium to long-term relief. We will be sharing details of all our work and reports from our grantees in a separate report.



This report is for the year 2022, a busy fifth year for us as we strengthened the pillars of our foundation. In March 2022, we were among the "Civil Space" contributors of the Women of the World Festival, İstanbul hosted in partnership with the WOW – Women of the World Foundation and British Council and with the support of İstanbul Metropolitan Municipality. In May 2022, we organised a meeting to update our donors on the impact of our Wildfire Relief and Mitigation Fund. In June 2022, we hosted our annual donor dinner at the British Library. Presenting our work in the home of Magna Carta and the Enigma Machine was unforgettable. Our guests had the opportunity to hear first-hand from Hacer Foggo of the Deep Poverty Network and learn more about our wider area of themed funds. We held our fourth Study Trip in İstanbul in July 2022 and our team and donors had the opportunity to hear from our grantees and the experts in the civil society space.


Thanks to the support of our community and many events that were organised to support our work, in 2022, we were able to raise GBP 193,480 and distribute GBP 152,095 across eight different funds: Children's Fund, Culture & Arts Fund, Deep Poverty Action Fund, Environmental Sustainability Fund, Gender Equality Fund, Institutional Fund, Meltem Göçer Fund, and also Donor Advised Grants.

Looking forward, we are proud to say that we are "still" optimistic and energised to work, even harder, to deliver our promise and create positive change. During our study trip, one of the valuable speakers referred to a metaphor, of the compost: an organism that can otherwise rot and die turns into a life-giving compost thanks to the presence of oxygen. He likened our work to the oxygen. We couldn't feel more proud.

# **OUR FUNDS**

2022 was a year in which the effects of economic and social crises were deeply felt by all disadvantaged groups and civil society organisations in Türkiye and all over the world, even though life started to normalise after the pandemic.

n our fifth year, as Turkey Mozaik Foundation, we continued to stand in solidarity with local and rights-based civil society organisations that work with great dedication in all the areas we prioritise. We supported thematic funds to be able to better manage our donations and fundraising efforts as well as to give supporters a means to make cause-specific donations.

#### Our funds are as follows:

- Children's Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of civil society organisations working to establish children's access to their basic rights.
- Culture & Arts Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of culture and arts organisations and civil society organisations that use culture and arts-related activities as a means to improve cultural rights, participation in public life and social cohesion.
- Deep Poverty Action Fund was launched in May 2021 to address deep poverty and widening inequalities in Türkiye.
- Emergency Relief Fund aims to support organisations and people affected by natural disasters or other adverse events whose needs are urgent and time-sensitive.
- Environmental Sustainability Fund was launched in March 2021, and in its second year, aimed to support projects focusing on the protection of Türkiye's marine biodiversity and coastal environment.
- Gender Equality Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of women's and LGBTI+ organisations working to promote women's rights and gender equality in Türkiye.

- Institutional Fund aims to strengthen and build the organisational core capacity of civil society organisations.
- Meltem Göçer Fund was established in August 2019 in memory of our beloved friend.

We collaborate with our local partner Support Foundation for Civil Society (Sivil Toplum için Destek Vakfi, STDV) throughout our grant process. Turkey Mozaik Foundation commits to a minimum grant amount for each fund. To facilitate this, a call for proposals for each fund, outlining specific priorities and application criteria, is announced on the websites and social media outlets of both organisations.

Following a careful evaluation and shortlisting process, conducted in line with stringent assessment criteria, Turkey Mozaik Foundation's board, in collaboration with experts from STDV, determine the final list of grantees for each fund. This approach ensures that some organisations receive sole funding from us, while others are recipients of co-funding in conjunction with STDV.

Once the selection process is finalised, each organisation enters into a formal grant agreement with STDV. This agreement comprehensively defines the scope of activities to be supported, and it is accompanied by a detailed budget. STDV is responsible for delivering three distinct reports – initiation, interim, and final – to Turkey Mozaik Foundation, pertaining to both the fund as a whole and the progress of each grantee.

We reviewed over 263 applications and selected 35 organisations to support in 2022. The breakdown by fund of the grants distributed this year is as follows:

# **EVENTS HIGHLIGHTS**

## Women Of The World Festival, March 2022

We were among the participants of the WOW - Women of the World Festival in İstanbul, organised by the Women of the World Foundation, the British Council and the İstanbul Metropolitan Municipality. We contributed to the "Civil Space" section of the festival for two days at Müze Gazhane and shared our story, our grants and our vision for gender equality with the visitors.





## Annual Meeting & Dinner, June 2022

We hosted our Annual Dinner at the iconic British Library in June 2022. We shared with our amazing audience highlights from our work in 2021 and the impact we have created over the last four years, which could not have been possible without our supporters. Our special guest was Hacer Foggo, who joined us to talk about her inspirational work of combating deep poverty in Türkiye. With the generous contributions of our guests, who included some of our existing supporters as well as new faces joining us in the evening, we raised over £60,000 for our thematic funds.

## Turkey Wildfire Relief And Mitigation Fund Meeting, May 2022

When the wildfires were sweeping forests in Türkiye during the summer of 2021, we started an Emergency Relief and Mitigation Fund. We held our first in-person event in London in May 2022, after the pandemic, and met with our donors and supporters to share the impactful work of our Turkey Wildfire Relief and Mitigation Fund grantees, who work to reduce the impacts of climate change and engage communities to advance relief and conservation efforts. Our grantees provided emergency relief and invested in mid-to-long-term recovery after the wildfires of 2021 in Türkiye.



## Study Trip, July 2022

We held our fourth Study Trip in İstanbul in July 2022. For two days we, along with attending donors, had the opportunity to meet with some of our grantees and leading experts in Türkiye's civil society who put their hearts and minds into their work.

The first day started with a discussion on Türkiye's political environment led by Ruşen Çakır, founder of Medyascope.tv and a pioneer of solution journalism in Türkiye, followed by a panel on Poverty in Türkiye, with Hacer Foggo, İlayda Eskitaşçıoğlu (We Need to Talk Association) and Melda Akbaş (Tarlabaşı Community Centre), where we talked about how deep poverty affects women and children. The afternoon session, moderated by Ergem Şenyuva, focused on the climate crisis, its consequences and measures to be taken urgently, with Ümit Şahin (İstanbul Policy Centre) and Gaye Tuğrulöz (Social Climate Association).



The second day started with a panel on Youth Politics in Türkiye, with Demet Lüküslü (Yeditepe University), Hasan Oğuzhan Aytaç (Youth Organisation Forum) and İnanç Sümbüloğlu (Bir Iz Association). In the final session, Özgür Arun (Senex Association for Aging Studies) shared with us the findings of the association's monitoring of violence and discrimination against older people.



## London-Brighton Cycle Ride, September 2022

n September, the team of 15 Turkey Mozaik Foundation supporters cycled 55 miles for the London to Brighton Cycle Ride, and raised over £13,000. We are proud to have such amazing friends and supporters who teamed up and took part in this challenge to raise funds to support our work.

## Deep Poverty Network Strategy Meeting, October 2022

We met with the Deep Poverty Network, one of our grantees, in İstanbul at the network's strategy meeting organised by our partner, the Support Foundation for Civil Society. The Deep Poverty Network shared with us their future strategies and their key principles and activities to combat deep poverty by providing direct support to families, collecting data and monitoring their status, conducting research, advocating for policy and raising awareness. We are proud to support the Deep Poverty Network in their fight against deep poverty and widening inequalities in Türkiye.

# **OUR LOCAL PARTNER**



Our partnership with the Support Foundation for Civil Society (Sivil Toplum için Destek Vakfı, STDV) grew stronger in 2022.

STDV, established in 2015, has a primary mission: to foster the growth of civil society and philanthropy in Türkiye by acting as a bridge between the priorities of donors and the needs of civil society organisations. STDV collaborates closely with both individual and corporate donors, playing a pivotal role in building a dedicated pool of funds and executing grant programs. The Foundation offers a comprehensive suite of philanthropic services to donors, encompassing participation in pooled funds, assistance with program design and implementation, and establishing donor-advised funds. As a leading partner, STDV brings invaluable local expertise and an extensive network within Türkiye's civil society landscape.

From January 2016 to June 2023, STDV has provided over TRY 70,000,000 grant support to more than 200 civil society organisations dedicated to various areas, including children's rights, culture and arts, education, environmental sustainability, gender equality, poverty, and more. This significant impact has been made possible through the collective contributions of over 3,000 individual and corporate donors who share a commitment to fostering positive change and progress in Türkiye.

#### Our partnership has four main aspects:

- **Due diligence:** Through our partnership with STDV we are able to donate through a trusted system that carries out the necessary due diligence on grant applications received.
- **Reporting:** STDV is our main partner helping us ensure transparent reporting of the use of funds.
- **Co-funding:** Majority of Turkey Mozaik Foundation grantees were jointly funded by STDV. Together, we are able to increase our impact.
- Events: STDV through their connective role host our annual study trips.

# **CHILDREN'S FUND**



The Children's Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of civil society organisations (CSOs) working to establish children's access to their basic rights. Some circumstances that adversely affect children's well-being in Türkiye are forced migration, rapid urbanisation, inter-regional inequalities, economic crisis, poverty, globalisation, conflicts, domestic violence, and gender inequalities.

In 2022, the Children's Fund provided grants to projects that support children's rights and well-being and the organisational development of CSOs working in this field. We provided grant support to projects that take these priorities into account, aiming to improve their organisational development and access to children's rights.


The call for applications was open between 26 October and 21 November 2022. A total of 47 applications meeting the technical criteria were received from 15 cities across Türkiye. 8 organisations applied for core funding while 39 organisations applied for project funding.



## All Children are Ours Association, İstanbul Bütün Çocuklar Bizim Derneği

Project grant: Our Lesson is About Bullying(Dersimiz Zorbalık Projesi)Amount: £4944 (TRY 113,000)

All Children are Ours Association (Bütün Çocuklar Bizim Derneği) works to support the education, well-being and healthy development of children, and to fight against all kinds of economic, social, legal, psychological, and cultural obstacles in this regard. The association provides in-kind support such as clothing, books, and school supplies for disadvantaged children, as well as scholarships to support their education.

All Children are Ours Association used this grant support to implement the "Our Lesson is Bullying" project. The association organised various activities featuring open discussions and enlightening video presentations for 3rd-grade students in a primary school and two community centres in disadvantaged neighbourhoods of İstanbul to raise awareness about bullying that the children may encounter at school. The activities reached over 70 children and 50 parents. The association shared a bullying story with the children through a puppet used by a ventriloquist and discussed the main theme of the story with the children. The meetings not only encouraged children to express themselves but also guided them through coping mechanisms for peer bullying and managing their emotional responses. Parents also attended seminars addressing peer bullying. A dedicated "No to Bullying" library with carefully chosen books was created in the school to foster a focus on the issue. The association employed a part-time project assistant with this grant support.

## Area of Work:

The All Children are Ours Association is committed to elevating children's education, well-being, and healthy development by addressing a wide array of challenges, including economic, social, legal, psychological, and cultural barriers.

## Area of Work:

The Flying Broom Women Communication and Research Association focuses on women's rights, gender equality, and advancing the participation of women in science and technology. Flying Broom Women Communication and Research Association (Uçan Süpürge Kadın İletişim ve Araştırma Derneği), established in Ankara, conducts research and studies at national and international levels on issues such as right to education, early and forced marriages, and rights-based media literacy in order to raise public awareness on the negative effects of gender inequality on the lives of women and girls.

The association is implementing "Girls Can STEM" project to contribute to the elimination of gender inequality in science and technology, support girls' orientation towards positive sciences, and encourage girls to work and produce in the fields of science and technology. Ten workshops and seminars in various provinces of Türkiye were organised to tackle gender stereotypes in STEM fields, aiming to reach 250 girls and 250 caregivers. In addition, three meetings were organised for children to get together with STEM professionals to inspire girls by introducing role models. Within the scope of this grant, the association employed a part-time project coordinator.

**Project grant:** Friends of the Earth Connecting with Validebağ (Yerküre Dostları Validebağ ile Bağ Kuruyor Projesi) **Amount:** £3588 (TRY 82,000)

Kozalak Association (Kozalak Derneği) works to ensure that all children, youth and adult learners acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to support sustainable development, spread sustainable lifestyles and develop global citizenship awareness through non-formal and/or formal education methods.

With this grant support, the association implemented the "Friends of the Earth Connecting with Validebağ" project to provide an opportunity for children aged 9-12 to explore the open space and engage in outdoor play, thus allowing them to get to know the natural habitat of Validebağ Grove. Through the knowledge, experiences, and awareness gained, the project equipped children with practices for sustainable living. The training program aimed to reach 120 children, and will be concluded by a forum, the content of which will be designed by the children.

## Area of Work:

The Kozalak Association promotes sustainable development and global citizenship through education. Their "Friends of the Earth Connecting with Validebağ" project educates children about Validebağ Grove's natural habitat and sustainable living practices.


Project grant: Colourful Hours (Renkli Saatler Projesi) Amount: £3938 (TRY 90,000)

## Area of Work:

The Olive Seeds Association provides free arts and education opportunities to socioeconomically disadvantaged children aged 7-11 through their "Colourful Hours" project, fostering their development. Established in Balıkesir, Olive Seeds Association (Zeytin Çekirdekleri Derneği) focuses on children's right to access education and arts, organises free music, art and sports training and provides support to children aged 7-11 who are socioeconomically disadvantaged and cannot access quality education and arts.

With this grant support, the association continued the "Colourful Hours" project, which has been implemented since 2019 for children between the ages of 7-11 who have difficulty accessing education and arts. Within the scope of this project, the association organised four group activities, each spanning five days, in Ayvalık. These gatherings saw the participation of approximately 25 children in each group, including children who had arrived from earthquake-affected areas. The activities included book reading, music, and art workshops, and library and museum visits for socio-economically and socio-culturally disadvantaged children. A literacy support group was also established to aid children facing difficulties in reading and writing.





# **CULTURE & ARTS FUND**

he Culture & Arts Fund aims to support the projects and organisational development of culture and arts organisations and civil society organisations (CSOs) that use culture and arts-related activities as a means to improve cultural rights, participation in public life and social cohesion. The fund was launched in 2019 in partnership with the Support Foundation for Civil Society and the content contribution of the İstanbul Foundation for Culture and Arts (IKSV).

In 2022, considering the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on the field of culture and arts, we prioritised supporting the organisational development of CSOs working in the field of culture and arts, supporting local communication, solidarity, and cooperation among civil stakeholders (artists, institutions, employees, etc.), and supporting activities aimed at ensuring the resilience of the field and its adaptation to current developments.


The call for applications was open between 3 June and 5 July 2022. A total of 37 applications meeting the technical criteria were received from 17 cities across Türkiye. 15 organisations applied for core funding while 22 organisations applied for project funding.



## Area of Work:

Kırkayak Kültür promotes social cohesion and a culture of coexistence by engaging with diverse communities. including refugees. through a range of art and research initiatives. Their mission is to enhance social development and cultivate culturally enriched living conditions, particularly among disadvantaged groups.

Kırkayak Culture Art and Nature Association (Kırkayak Kültür Sanat ve Doğa Derneği - Kırkayak Kültür) was established in Gaziantep with the aim of creating and increasing contact among groups and individuals with different socioeconomic backgrounds, in order to contribute to social cohesion and a culture of coexistence. The association, which also aims to increase social development, promote democratic values and create culturally rich living conditions, works with disadvantaged groups, refugees and migrants. The association carries out its activities in Kırkayak Art Centre and Kırkayak Culture and Migration Research Centre; and carries out activities under six programmes: Migration, Urban Studies, Culture and Art, Kitchen Matbakh Workshop (Gender Equality), Media for Social Cohesion, and Dom Studies.

Kırkayak Kültür is using this grant to ensure the financial sustainability of its Art Centre and to strengthen its Culture-Art Programme. The association is employing a part-time programme coordinator to develop 12 ideas for culture and arts events to be held at its centre, which will also include refugee artists, and transform these ideas into projects. Kırkayak Kültür is preparing a report, containing information about the association's past and current activities and future strategies. The report will be used in applications for different funding opportunities. Kırkayak Kültür is also preparing the Culture-Art Strategy Document to determine the two-year road map of its Art Centre.

Dem Association (Dem Derneği) aims to form areas of dialogue between the hearing society and the non-hearing society without creating feelings of pity, and works to offer solutions collectively. The association organises activities such as Turkish Sign Language trainings, workshops, and camps for various stakeholders to raise awareness on the subject. Through the bukalemun.co website, individuals can access digitalised sign language trainings and test their knowledge of the sign language.

The grant supported the "Koşar Adım Alt Yazıya" project. The association aims to produce data and raise awareness on detailed subtitling, a type of translation in which not only speech but also auditory elements are depicted in writing to provide deaf and hearing-impaired individuals with access to all auditory elements in the audiovisual content, to increase the visibility of best practices, and to strengthen potential collaborations in this field. The association is preparing a report on the status of detailed subtitling in Türkiye and sharing it with various public institutions, CSOs, private sector and media organisations. Detailed subtitles will be added to 10 movies to support the activities of the Access to Culture Platform, which aims to increase access to culture and arts activities. Dem Association will organise a meeting with stakeholders from cinema, television, festivals and digital platforms, and hearing-impaired and deaf individuals to create a space for sharing experiences and potential collaborations and to conduct a survey on the need for detailed subtitling. The association will prepare a video to raise awareness about the need/right for detailed subtitling and will add detailed subtitles to a movie that will be released.



#### Area of Work:

Dem Association bridges gaps between hearing and non-hearing communities. Their "Koşar Adım Alt Yazıya" project promotes detailed subtitling, fostering access for hearingimpaired individuals in audiovisual content and culture.

## Area of Work:

The Troya Cultural Association (CABININ) enhances collaboration among cultural actors in Çanakkale. Their project created a database of 168 cultural contributors and an interactive map, fostering partnerships. Troya Cultural Association (Çanakkale Biennial Initiative - CABININ) aims to bring together different segments of society with contemporary art, to increase the participation and productivity of disadvantaged groups in social life through artoriented activities, to promote the unique, historical, natural and cultural values of Çanakkale on an international scale, and to create international communication and cooperation networks for this purpose. CABININ organises and supports national and international events, including the Çanakkale Biennial.

With this grant support, CABININ implemented the "Çanakkale Cultural Actors Network" project to improve communication and cooperation between cultural actors, experts and culture and arts initiatives living and working in Çanakkale. CAB-ININ created a Çanakkale culture and art inventory and a map of cultural actors. For this purpose, CABININ conducted research and interviews through field visits, collected data, and identified 168 cultural actors who have settled in Çanakkale. A significant database has been created, which will be instrumental for future collaborations and activities in the region. The website www.Çanakkalebienali.com/yeni-komsular, which also includes the regularly updated digital map of the cultural actors network, was launched to increase the network's visibility. A video film about the Cultural Actors Network, prepared within the scope of this project, was published on YouTube and on social media by the association.

Theatre Cooperative aims to represent the collective voice of private theatres, find permanent legal solutions to sectoral problems, and improve and professionalise all production and implementation processes in the sector. Theatre Cooperative provides guidance to improve the capacity of its members economically, legally, socially, and academically, organises projects, campaigns, training, webinars, seminars, and workshops, and advocates for legislative changes in favour of private theatres.

With this grant support, Theatre Cooperative implemented the "Accessibility of Theatres" project in cooperation with the Everything Accessible Platform to make private theatre venues and activities more accessible and ensure the active participation of individuals with disabilities in culture and arts activities. Accessibility, awareness and communication training were provided to 20 people, including the management teams and field staff of theatres that are partners of the Theatre Cooperative. Field visits to six theatre venues were organised to encourage their inclusive transformation. After the visits, six physical accessibility status and recommendation reports were prepared and shared with the relevant theatres. A comprehensive "Guide to Accessibility of Theatres" was created based on data and information collected through pre and post-tests, interviews, and field visits. The guide, which also included an accessibility checklist, was disseminated among theatres.



# **DEEP POVERTY ACTION FUND**



he Deep Poverty Action Fund was launched in 2021 to address deep poverty and widening inequalities in Türkiye, which significantly worsened with the COVID-19 pandemic. In its first year, the fund supported the Mobile Food Bank project, a joint initiative of Turkey Mozaik Foundation's previous grantees, the Basic Needs Association and the Open Space Association. The project ensured the delivery of vital necessities including food and hygiene products regularly for eight months, and the provision of support to families by a social worker to help them break the cycle of deep poverty.

## Area of Work:

DERÍN YOKSULLUK

The Open Space Association fights extreme poverty through the Deep Poverty Network. With grant support, they enhance organisational capacity for advocacy, raise public awareness, and diversify resources. Open Space Association (Açık Alan Derneği) carries out activities in the fields of socio-cultural empowerment and poverty. The association established the Deep Poverty Network (Derin Yoksulluk Ağı, DYA) in March 2020, to combat extreme poverty. Since the beginning of the pandemic, DYA has been working on disadvantaged families' access to basic needs, such as food, hygiene materials and baby supplies. These needs were determined in field visits and shared with the donors who supplied them via the e-commerce sites of the markets and sent directly to the families without any intermediaries. DYA has been working to increase the impact of this model and conducting research and advocacy activities to combat poverty.

With this grant support, DYA is improving its advocacy capacity and financial sustainability. To this end, the association is preparing a 2-year research and advocacy strategy plan. DYA is also working to raise public awareness by documenting and making visible rights violations faced by those living in deep poverty and to draw the attention of politicians. For this purpose, DYA conducted field visits in İstanbul, collected data and issued an information note titled "Women's and Children's Poverty in Türkiye" and a detailed field observation report focusing specifically on hygiene poverty. Members of the association participated in various TV and radio programs to share their findings about the impact of deep poverty on the people. In addition, the association is working to increase its resource diversity. Within the scope of this grant support, DYA is employing a full-time Resource Development Coordinator and Advocacy Coordinator.





# **ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY FUND**

The Environmental Sustainability Fund was launched in 2021 in partnership with the Support Foundation for Civil Society and the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD). The fund aimed to support the digital transformation of CSOs working in the field of environmental sustainability with grant and capacity-building support.

In 2022, we partnered with the Conservation Collective to launch the Turquoise Coast Environment Fund (TCEF) to protect, restore, and regenerate the natural beauty, biodiversity and ecosystems of the exceptional marine and coastal resources of Türkiye. TCEF, in partnership with the Support Foundation for Civil Society, MAVA Foundation, GEF Small Grants Program, and the UNDP, supports projects focusing on the protection of Türkiye's marine biodiversity and coastal environment. The fund aims to aid local communities in becoming actively involved in, and part of, the change towards sustainable food systems, biodiversity and ecosystem conservation, and building local organisations for the sustainable future of the coastlines.

In TCEF's first round, in collaboration with the fund's partners, a total of £103,315 (TRY 2,098,346) was granted to 13 CSOs. Turkey Mozaik Foundation contributed £10,000 to the Fund.

# **GENDER EQUALITY FUND**

he Gender Equality Fund aims to support civil society initiatives that promote women's rights and gender equality in Türkiye through new and innovative projects, campaigns and advocacy activities and institutional development of women's and LGBTI+ organisations. The fund was launched in 2019 in partnership with the Support Foundation for Civil Society.

The call for applications was open between 17 April and 11 May 2022. A total of 51 applications meeting the technical criteria were received from 23 cities across Türkiye. 10 organisations applied for core funding while 41 organisations applied for project funding.



Foundation for Women's Solidarity (Kadın Dayanışma Vakfı), established in Ankara, is combating all forms of gender-based violence, and strengthening women's solidarity against gender-based violence. The Foundation, which has established Ankara's first women's counselling centre where women who have been subjected to violence can receive free support, carries out awareness-raising activities targeting women, other civil society organisations, and professionals working in this field.

Foundation for Women's Solidarity used this grant support to implement the "Strengthening Women's Solidarity with the Women's Counselling Centre" project. With the project, the capacity of the Foundation and its women's counselling centre was improved by employing a full-time social worker and a part-time financial and administrative affairs officer for eight months. Improving its human resources enabled the Foundation to extend the operational days of the women's counselling centre from three to four days a week to reach more women. Over the course of the project, the women's counselling centre received a total of 492 applications, who were provided with information and guidance on a wide range of issues and were connected with the appropriate institutions for further support. 178 women who had experienced various forms of violence were provided with long-term, empowering psychosocial counselling and information on support mechanisms by the social worker. The social worker also organised awareness-raising meetings about gender inequality, violence against women, women's legal rights, and how to combat violence, targeting Turkish and Syrian women living in Ankara.



## Area of Work:

The Foundation for Women's Solidarity combats genderbased violence and gender inequality. With grant support, they expanded the capacity of their women's counselling centre, providing critical support to women who experienced violence and empowered Turkish and Syrian women through awareness meetings.

## Area of Work:

LISTAG promotes acceptance and dignity for LGBTI+ individuals and their families. With grant support, they diversify resources, engage donors, and craft products for fundraising, enhancing their financial sustainability. amilies and Friends of LGBTI+s Association (Lezbiyen Gey Biseksüel Trans Art Bireylerin Aileleri ve Yakınları Derneği - LİSTAG) works to ensure that families accept their LGBTI+ children and/or relatives, LGBTI+s live their lives with dignity and are accepted in society. In this context, LISTAG carries out various awarenessraising activities to inform LGBTI+ families and/or relatives and provides counselling to CSOs and association members regarding the problems and difficulties faced by LGBTI+s. The association carries out advocacy activities for the implementation of the necessary laws and policies for LGBTI+s to achieve full equality, increase the level of awareness in society about LGBTI+ rights and ensure a change of attitude.

LISTAG used this grant support to increase the diversity of the association's resources and ensure its financial sustainability. For this purpose, the association worked with a mentor assigned under the capacity-development component of the grant support on developing alternative funding models, increasing the number of individual and corporate donors, preparing a strategy for financial sustainability and improving the LISTAG Friends Network. The association prepared a list of existing and potential individual and corporate donors, explored new fundraising methods and tools in detail, and conducted market research on products that could be sold for fundraising. Design and production workshops were held with LISTAG volunteers to produce handcrafted products to be sold for fundraising. Detailed information about the products and different ways of supporting the association was shared on social media and with potential corporate donors. With the grant support, LISTAG employed a full-time financial and administrative affairs officer and covered the association's office rent and administrative expenses.





## Mimoza Women's Association, Mersin Mimoza Kadın Derneği

Mimoza Women's Association (Mimoza Kadın Derneği), established in Mersin, is working to combat all kinds of violence caused by gender inequality, raise awareness about gender equality and violence, and ensure gender equality and prevent violence against women. Mimoza Women's Association works to empower women socially, economically, politically and culturally, to make women's rights visible and for women to benefit equally from all opportunities.

Mimoza Women's Association used this grant support to increase the diversity of the association's resources and ensure its financial sustainability. For this purpose, the association employed a full-time secretariat and case management coordinator, which enabled the association to coordinate its activities and workflow more effectively, manage and follow up on applicant women's cases, and increase its visibility on social media and through outreach activities. The association worked with a mentor assigned under the capacity-development component of the grant support on the topics of financial sustainability, fundraising, mapping income sources, financial strategic planning, risk analysis and risk prevention, financial procedures, stakeholder analysis, and grant applications. Throughout the grant period, the number of the association's individual donors increased by 100% and the amount of membership fees increased by 118%. The association's three grant applications were successful. The grant was also used to cover office rent and administrative expenses.

## Area of Work:

Mimoza Women's Association promotes gender equality and combats violence against women. With grant support, they increased resources, gained donors, and covered expenses, advancing their mission.

## Area of Work:

We Need to Talk Association advances menstrual equity by promoting accessible products, education, and awareness. With grant support, the association increased fundraising efforts, fostered partnerships with corporate and individual donors. and strengthened overall organisational capacity.

We Need to Talk Association (Konuşmamız Gerek Derneği) is working to increase the accessibility, quality and sustainability of menstrual products, contribute to the dissemination of data collection and content creation on menstrual poverty and experiences in Türkiye, and ensure the inclusion of comprehensive sexuality and menstruation education in the National Education Curriculum. The association considers women's inability to access comprehensive and accurate information about menstruation as a part of menstrual poverty and organises various trainings and workshops in this context.

We Need to Talk Association used this grant support to strengthen its fundraising capacity and organisational structure. In line with this purpose, the association received expert support and worked with a mentor on alternative methods of fundraising, financial strategy, communication, and donor relations. The association contacted potential corporate donors with the newly prepared presentation highlighting the association's mission and impact and started receiving donations through its awareness-raising training program in exchange for contributions. The association started using Fonzip, an online donation collection system and shared online donation certificates through its updated website, which increased the number of its individual donors. The association successfully applied for grants and secured vital funding for its key staff for the next year, enhancing its organisational capacity. With the grant support, the association employed a coordinator and a financial advisor.





# **INSTITUTIONAL FUND**

he Institutional Fund aims to strengthen and build the organisational core capacity of civil society organisations (CSOs) by covering costs such as rent, human resources, expert support, and travel. The fund also includes a capacity-building component to provide mentoring focusing on improving resource development and financial sustainability, impact measurement, monitoring and evaluation, internal/external communications, and stakeholder relations and advocacy activities.


In the 2022 period of the Institutional Fund, we focused on supporting CSOs in strengthening their capacities in selected areas of organisational development and offering various opportunities, especially working with mentors, within the capacity-building component of the fund.


The call for applications was open between 16 September and 20 October 2022. A total of 100 applications meeting the technical criteria were received from 22 cities across Türkiye.

#### Area of Work:

MEDAK coordinates disaster response and improves healthcare access, especially for women and children. With grant support, they enhance sustainability, engage potential donors, and boost visibility through and outreach. Medical Search and Rescue Association (Medikal Arama Kurtarma Derneği -MEDAK) aims to provide the coordination required for trained medical personnel to provide active field service in and around the ground zero of disasters such as earthquakes, fires, floods, major accidents, civil disturbances, and rural search and rescue situations, and to provide this personnel with the necessary training for selfsustaining and life-saving tasks in emergencies. MEDAK also aims to mediate the access of vulnerable groups to the right to health in non-emergency situations and works for women and children to access health services more easily through digital means.

With this grant support, MEDAK is carrying out activities to increase the diversity of the association's resources and ensure its financial sustainability. To this end, MEDAK is preparing a fundraising strategy and working to localise and share its experiences in the field of mobile health. MEDAK is creating a pool of potential donors who may be interested in global health and is working to establish possible collaborations with the Health Emergency Preparedness and Response (HERA), which operates in the USA. MEDAK is also preparing a list of private sector organisations with potential for cooperation. MEDAK is carrying out communication activities to render its work more visible and reach potential donors.

Established in Ankara, the Research Association for Democracy, Peace, and Alternative Politics Association (Demokrasi, Barış ve Alternatif Politikalar Araştırma Derneği - DEMOS), conducts research, analyses, and translations around peace studies from a gender perspective. At the same time, the association engages in critical and accessible knowledge production for and with rights subjects, as well as organisations, activists and researchers involved in the struggle for societal peace. DEMOS shares this knowledge through print and digital media, podcasts, conferences, workshops, and seminars.

With this grant support, DEMOS is working on enhancing its capacity for measuring impact. For this purpose, DEMOS is creating an impact monitoring and evaluation model rooted in qualitative data analysis in order to gain deeper insights into the extent to which its ongoing activities contribute to its strategic goals and to improve these activities. The resulting data will be used in communication and resource development activities targeting various stakeholders. DEMOS is actively forging collaborations with diverse CSOs and academics to identify the tools and methodologies suitable for gender-based impact assessment. Through these collaborations, it is aimed to foster spaces where diverse groups can engage in collective thinking and learning. DEMOS is diligently selecting data analysis tools and carrying out activities to ensure their effective utilisation within the team. Within the scope of this grant support, DEMOS is employing a part-time impact evaluation expert.

DEMOS focuses on peace studies from a gender perspective and knowledge production for rights subjects. With grant support, they will enhance measurement, fostering collective thinking and learning through collaborations.

Roots & Shoots Turkey (Kökler ve Filizler Derneği) a global program for children and young people, organises meetings, workshops, events and trainings to contribute to improving the knowledge and skills of children and young people in the areas they need. The association also works on the awareness of children's rights to prevent risks such as bullying, violation of privacy, commercial exploitation and tokenism that children and young people are exposed to. At the same time, the association, which carries out activities involving young people for the continuation of life and diversity on Earth, opens spaces for children and young people on issues and social problems that they want to create change and works for the effective participation of these groups.

With this grant support, the association is working to increase the diversity of its resources and ensure its financial sustainability. For this purpose, the association is crafting a communication strategy tailored to both individual and corporate donors, updating the donation page of its website, and preparing donation certificates. Roots & Shoots Turkey is in the process of gearing up for mass e-mail campaigns and streamlining the donation process through Fonzip, an online donation-collecting platform. To reach more donors, the association is creating online content describing its impactful activities, which will be amplified through strategic advertising on platforms such as Google, Facebook, Instagram, and YouTube. Additionally, the association is compiling lists of potential donors within the private sector, and actively pursuing collaborative opportunities through meetings. Within the scope of this grant support, Roots & Shoots Turkey is employing a part-time staff member responsible for fundraising.

Project Grant: A New Education Model for Seasonal Agricultural Worker Students (Mevsimlik Tarım İşçisi Öğrencilere Yönelik Yeni Bir Eğitim Modeli)Amount: £5688 (TRY 130,000)

#### Area of Work:

The Local Development Association advances holistic development and runs projects for children. With grant support, they execute a programme to ensure that agricultural worker students don't miss out on academic milestones by training teachers and providing access to educational materials. Established in Şanlıurfa, the Local Development Association (Yerelden Kalkınma Derneği) aims to contribute to the rooting of pluralist democracy and the improvement of the society's quality of life. The association aims at holistic development with the mobilisation of local and regional potential, carries out activities that promote economic and social development as well as cultural and environmental sustainability and contributes to policy-making in these areas. The association develops various projects for disadvantaged children living in Şanlıurfa, especially seasonal agricultural workers.

With the grant support from our Meltem Göçer Fund, the association is implementing the project "A New Education Model for Seasonal Agricultural Worker Students". The association crafted an accelerated education curriculum for 60 agricultural worker students in 8th grade studying at a primary school in the Eyyubiye district of Şanlıurfa. This innovative education program, developed in collaboration with the school administration, the governorship, and the Provincial Directorate of National Education, aims to ensure that these students won't have to miss out on important academic milestones, even if they start the year later than their peers. Within the scope of this education model, a 5-day trainer's training will be organised for teachers on how to approach seasonal agricultural worker students. To support children's access to educational materials, the association purchased 60 high school entrance exam preparation sets and 420 test books. Within the scope of this grant support, the association is employing a project coordinator.



# **DONOR ADVISED GRANTS**

The Donor Advised Fund consists of grants given to civil society organisations that are brought forward at the request of our donors and board members. These requests are discussed based on the same selection criteria as all other grantees and the charities are supported upon approval by Turkey Mozaik Foundation Board.

Project grant: Psychosocial Support Workshop (Psikososyal Destek Atölyesi Projesi) Amount: £4000 (TRY 86,000)

RUMUD develops and implements socio-psychological and cultural projects to provide equal cultural and social opportunities for children and women who are affected by the conflicts in the Sur-Diyarbakır region. The association organises workshops on arts, gender equality, and respect for differences with children and has a toy library through which children can access toys for free.

With this grant support, RUMUD organised 6 music, philosophy, photography, upcycling, life skills, and oral history workshops engaging a total of 60 children between the ages of 8-16 living in the Sur district of Diyarbakır. The grant is provided with the support of the Tartan Army Sunshine Appeal which has visited Diyarbakır and met with the representatives of RUMUD.

Cocusing on ageing studies, Senex | Association for Aging Studies develops learning programmes, advocacy and academic studies, scientific research, art activities and monitoring studies programmes with a human rights sensitive and gender mainstreaming approach. With this grant support, Senex is monitoring media coverage and collecting data on cases of violence, abuse, neglect, violation and discrimination against older people. The cases are analysed and monthly statistical reports are shared both with the public and relevant national and international human rights bodies. This way, the association is advocating for and contributing to the development of lasting solutions in favour of older people, collaborating with civil society, the private sector, public institutions, and local administrations.

to reach out to and work with more students, enhancing the orchestra's capacity.







